

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




OUR MISSION AND VISION

ALIMIYYAH OVERVIEW

HIRA's One Year Islamic Studies Program is meticulously designed to cater specifically to knowledge-seeking students who wish to acquire foundational knowledge in all core disciplines of Islamic traditions. It serves as the initial year of a comprehensive six-year `Ālimiyyah Program intended for those seeking to pursue a degree in Islamic scholarship.

The `Ālimiyyah program encompasses a wide range of educational components, including the study of traditional Islamic arts, such as Islamic law (Fiqh), Islamic theology (Aqīdah), Qur'ānic exegesis (Tafsir), Hadith sciences, Arabic language, Islamic history, and more. This comprehensive curriculum ensures that students receive a well-rounded education in the various aspects of Islamic knowledge.

The program is not solely focused on academic pursuits but also strongly emphasizes spiritual development. It aims to cultivate a deep understanding of the Islamic faith and nurture a strong connection with Allah. Students are encouraged to engage in spiritual practices, develop a profound love for the Qur'ān and Sunnah, and incorporate Islamic values and ethics into their daily lives.







Course Name: Introduction to Shamā'il (Traits and Characteristics of the Prophet Muhammad ﷺ)



During the memorization journey, individuals learn to recite the verses of the Qur'ān with proper Tajwīd (pronunciation) and Tarteel (melodic rhythm). They strive to preserve the originality and eloquence of the Qur'ānic text, following the examples set by the Prophet Muhammad and his companions. Qur'ān memorization is seen as a spiritually enriching experience, fostering a profound connection with Allah and His divine message. It instills discipline, patience, and perseverance as students consistently dedicate significant time and effort to review and revise their memorization. Many individuals undertake this endeavor from a young age, participating in specialized programs or Qur'ānic schools to support their memorization journey.

Memorizing the Qur'ān is considered a great accomplishment and a means of earning blessings and rewards in this life and the hereafter. Those who have memorized the entire Qur'ān are highly respected in the Muslim community and are often regarded as Hafiz or Hafizah, a title that signifies their achievement and dedication to preserving the words of Allah.

- Recite the Qur'an as it was revealed to the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) with
 proper pronunciation and correct application of the rules of Tajwīd. Develop the skills to recite
 the Qur'an accurately and with appropriate intonation and rhythm.

These outcomes reflect the foundational knowledge and skills that students should aim to achieve in each subject. By attaining these outcomes, students are taking essential steps toward fulfilling their role as seekers of knowledge and developing a strong connection with their faith.
