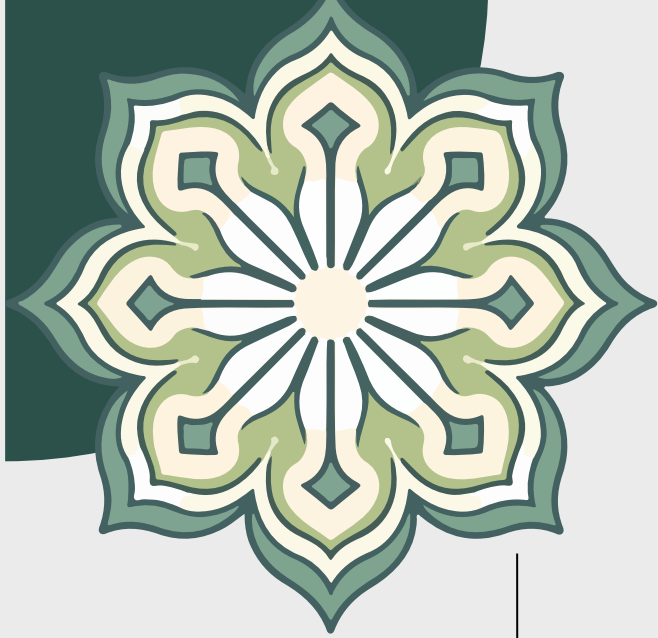

OVERVIEW OF PROBLEM

According to the Louisville Coalition for the Homeless, there has been a significant increase in the number of unsheltered residents in the metro area during the first few months of 2023. In the week of January 24, 2023, a team of homeless outreach workers identified 581 individuals living on the streets of Louisville without access to shelter. This number is more than double the count from a comparable week in 2022, which recorded only 243 unsheltered individuals.

The Coalition emphasized that this surge represents a staggering 139% increase in the number of unsheltered people in Louisville during any given week. The rise in unsheltered residents highlights the urgency of addressing homelessness and providing adequate support and resources to those in need.





MISSION AND VISION

PLAN OF ACTION



1. Mobile Soup Kitchen

- a. Find a Food Truck
- b. Hire a person to work the food truck and serve the homeless hot meals

2. Free Health Clinic

- a. Find a location for it (open tent with heaters maybe) or do a mobile clinic
- b. Gather medical staff and medical volunteers to run it
- c. Determine list of possible treatments
- d. Make sure of all the legal concerns
- e. Maybe Partner with Phoenix Health Center For The Homeless to save costs and legal issues

3. Clothing Drive

- a. Set up Boxes for the Clothing Drive at different spots
 - i. Mosques, Churches, Temples, etc
 - ii. Each \$2500
- b. Pass out Clothing at Educational Events as incentive

4. Therapy and Vocational Rehabilitation Counseling

- a. Find Volunteer Counselors
- b. Hold at Muhammad Ali Center

5. Job Placement and Life Coaching

- a. Hold at Muhammad Ali Center
- b. Find people to discuss these events

6. Mobile Shelter

- a. Many homeless people are seeking shelter, so having this as an incentive to them attending classes and events can be effective

Establish a soup kitchen to serve hot meals to the homeless.

Add a food pantry to serve the low income families with groceries and essentials.

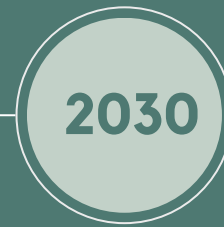

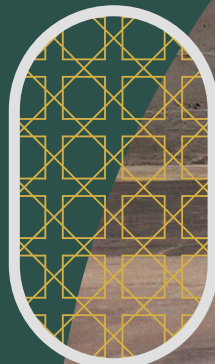

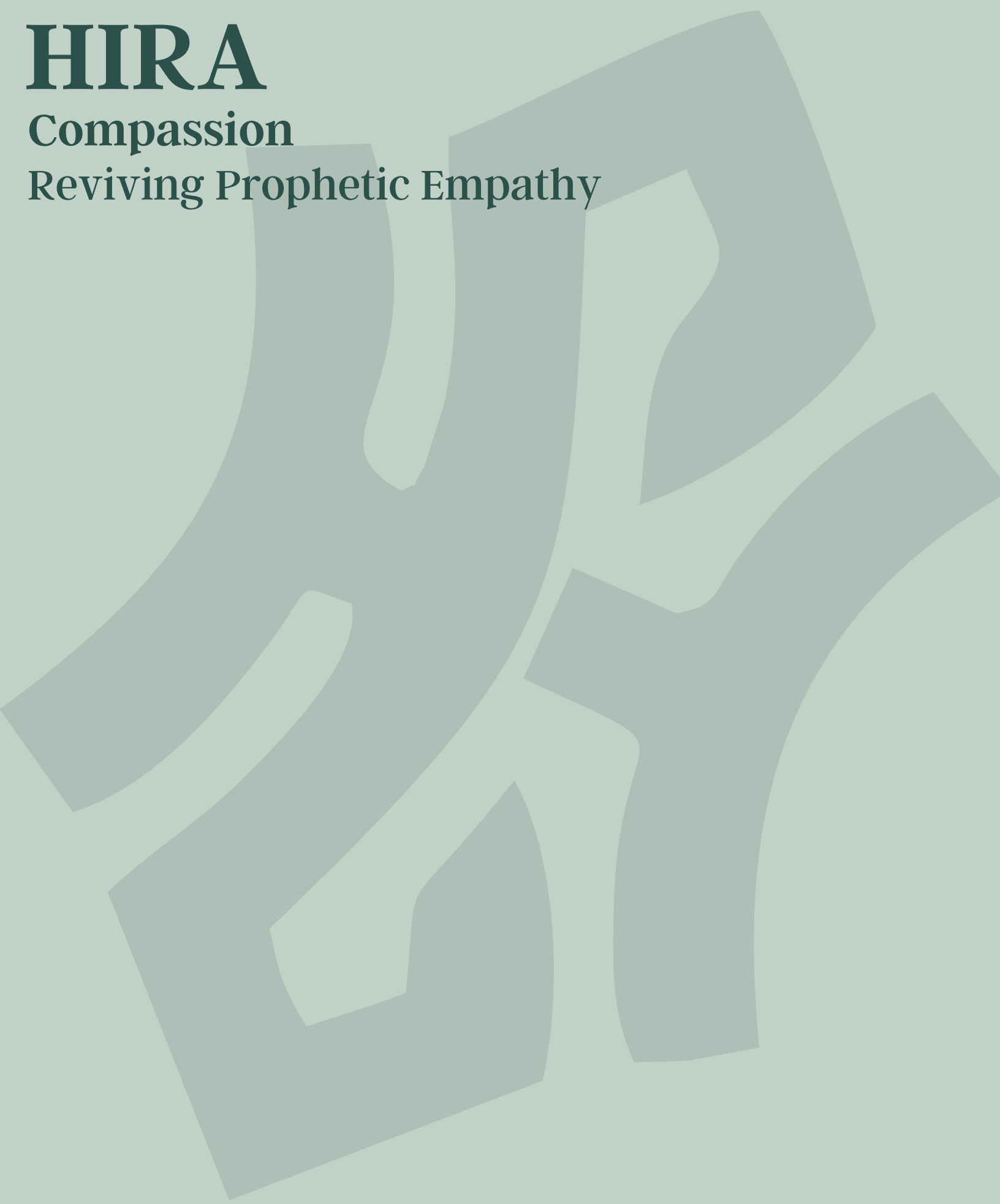
